HIV cases reported by year reflect cases that were originally reported as HIV regardless of current status (includes cases have been updated to AIDS). These HIV cases cannot be added with AIDS cases to get combined totals since the categories are not mutually exclusive. Rank reflects statewide AIDS and HIV case ranking (n=67) by county of diagnosis at the time this report was issued. Totals *do not include* cases living and receiving services here who were initially reported in other states or other Florida counties (n=300 est). Totals *include* cases reported from within the Florida Department of Corrections. Data is adjusted when cases are determined to have been reported earlier in another state or Florida county.

About 1 in 168 Floridians have HIV (1 in 346 Whites, 1 in 46 Blacks, & 1 in 176 Hispanics). An Estimated 100,000 Floridians are Living with HIV.

Nationally, Florida Ranks 3rd in Adult AIDS Cases (10% of U.S. Total), 2nd in Children (16%).

AIDS is Currently the Leading Cause of Death Among African Americans Aged 25 to 44 Years in the U.S. (4th among Floridians of same age)



As of year-end 2005, 1 million persons are estimated to be living with HIV in the US.

Half of all new HIV infections in the US in recent years have been among African Americans.

U.S. Cases are Growing Fastest Among: Youth, Minorities, Women, Young MSM and Heterosexuals

More than 70% of Global HIV Infections are Attributed to Heterosexual Contact.

An estimated 7,000 persons die daily of complications of AIDS in Africa. By 2010, AIDS may orphan 18 million African children.

India, (with 7.4 million people living with HIV) is home to one in six HIV-positive persons worldwide.
